While our Champagnat Marist spirituality originated with Marcellin and the early Brothers it has and continues to be enriched by successive generations of Champagnat's followers. One of the characteristics of our present age is a thirst for spirituality. As Marists we are invited to join with Mary in our journey of faith.

CONTENT

As Marcellin expressed in his last Testament one of the key elements which made up the core of his spirituality and that of his Little Brothers was confidence in God's presence. Marcellin urged his Brothers to adopt the practice of the presence of God. This for Marcellin was at the heart of his spirituality.

When Marcellin and Br Stanislaus became lost at night in a snowstorm he prayed the *Memorare*. His faith in God's saving presence was with him always and he trusted Mary without question. This event, which the early Brother considered a miracle was an external manifestation of his deep spirituality.

 - His spirituality rested on the solid foundation of his love for God and others. Marcellin's God was not an abstract God. He profoundly loved the humanity of God revealed in Jesus.
 - He was convinced that in order to have a loving relationship with God he also needed to cultivate a loving relationship with others.
 - Through the exercise of the presence of God, we see how Marcellin desired and sought out the company of a God near and dear to him.

The incarnational nature of Marcellin's spirituality was the source of his practice of the presence of God; he had a passion for both the Lord and his mission. For Marcellin, Jesus was always close at hand. Consequently, his conversations with the Lord continued uninterrupted, and his confidence in him and abandonment to God's will deepened over time. He often quoted the words of Psalm 127, "If the Lord does not build a house, in vain do its builders toil". (P. 50).
